Blessing of the new building

It is with excitement and pride that the Board of Trustees invite you to the Blessing Ceremony, this Saturday at 6.30am. At the time of reading this, hopefully we will have secured the code of compliance.

This customary blessing ceremony is known as kawanga whare: the formal pre-dawn ceremony to open a new building, For us this is an acknowledgement of the stories of the past and how they will be woven into the future of our school. Because this newly built learning space has been made of timber from the forests of the atua, Tāne-mahuta, and rests on tribal lands, we acknowledge and follow the tikanga associated with kawanga whare, which is the lifting of the tapu from these buildings so they can be used by everyone.

are able to cater appropriately). A desk will be outside the office space to record your name and numbers attending.

Discussed the sandpit project - Rachael shared that the previous sandpit had been covered over by the new playground. The Year 1-3 classes have raised over \$1000 in pinecone and toy sales and approx \$500 in Kawakawa Balm sales over the past 2 years. Suggested a contribution from PTFA to support the building of the new sandpit once the garden area and placement is decided. Some funds to be set aside for gardening resources - agreed
