Korimako (Bellbird)

In establishing the space for the new modular buildings the small bush area had to be cleared. This was the home for the Korimako (NZ Bellbird) who visited our school

every year, re-establishing the Makomako trees and other native plantings will be a priority so that the Korimako once again sing in our playground.

Kereru (Pigeon)

Guardians of the forest. This will be the name of the administration (Room 3/4) block.



Huia (Woodpecker) Our historic block. This building, currently under restoration is a significant feature of our environment. In selecting Huia. the name we acknowledge our link to history, the importance of preservation.
