The excitement and nerves when we arrived at school on judging day, animals cleaned, other children rushing to acknowledge our arrival, being awarded the ribbons, and finding out I could attend finals day in Levin. It was exciting. For some of our families it was the first time they have ever participated in this sort of activity and I would like to acknowledge their commitment!

For over 100 years communities around NZ have also included the "home" crafts in their events. At Manakau over recent years cake decorating, rural themed art, and flower creations have all been included. It is an opportunity to participate for all of our students and we, the teaching staff, are always thinking about the activities we include, and how we can do this well.

School. The team of D.S. O'Leary have done a fantastic job of restoring our historic building and their workmanship and flexibility has made the project a delight to be involved in. At this weekend's country fair you will be able to take a sneak peak inside. We will not be opening the entire block, however the safety fencing will be removed and you will be able to get a true sense of the massive job that has been undertaken.

This project has been about ensuring the children at Manakau School are able to learn in environments that are fit for 21st Century learners. Including the basics of acoustics, lighting and heating have been at the forefront of the restoration, as has ensuring the historic significance of Huia is intact. It is and will continue to be one of the last remaining historic school buildings still in operation in New Zealand.

The Grand Re-Opening will be held on Friday 4th December at 11am. I hope you will be able to join us.

Levin-Waitarere Surf Life Saving Club Junior Surf Program 2020/2021

What is Junior Surf?

A surf lifesaving program for children aged 6 to 13, fostering confidence and safety in the surf and on the beaches. Participants will learn surf lifesaving techniques, such as wading, duck diving, body surfing, craft operation, plus more.

We run the sessions every Saturday afternoon (2.30pm to 4.00pm) from the 12th December 2020 to the 6th March 2021. We also have a holiday Program (for ages 7-13) over two weeks in January.

Registration will take place on Sunday, November 29th between 10.00am – 11.30am at the Horowhenua Aquatic Centre. Each child will be required to do a small swim assessment.

Juniors from 7-13 years have the opportunity to compete at carnivals throughout the summer season. Carnivals are a great way to participate in both a fun and competitive environment, meet juniors from other clubs and see other beaches. While it can be competitive at times, the emphasis is always on safety, sportsmanship and enjoyment.
