A surf lifesaving program for children aged 6 to 13, fostering confidence and safety in the surf and on the beaches. Participants will learn surf lifesaving techniques, such as wading, duck diving, body surfing, craft operation, plus more. We run the sessions every Saturday afternoon (2.30pm to 4.00pm) from the 4th December 2021 to the 5th March 2022. We also have a holiday Program (for ages 7-13) over two weeks in January.
