We are super lucky to have a balance of bring your own devices (byod - children have their own computer that they use at school) and school leased devices. We also have access to the Te Hinaki Trust which supports families who want to get a device for their child/children (\$100 contribution from the family/ balance covered by the trust).

If you are thinking about Christmas:) and are going to buy a device please make sure you are purchasing a Chrome Book. We load the chrome book onto our school system and are able to monitor and share learning. This process ensures that we can support safe use. Devices are required from Year 4.

- * Children can collect their own belongings, then teachers will send children out via the decks, on each class, at the end of the day.
