### From Deb's desk

Nga mai hoki mai ki te kura o Manakau - Welcome back to Manakau School.

We have had a wonderful start to 2023. Over the past 2 weeks our classes have focused on the establishment phase. Setting routine, revisiting expectations and learning about how we work together in our new classes. It really has been great to have everyone back on site ready and raring to go!

This term across the team you will hear and see discussions around our school vision - Developing future guardians of our changing world. Each of the classes has chosen a focus area. The teaching team has let you know what the specific focus is in their class panui (notice), which you will receive today. There are lots of exciting learning opportunities planned for your children.

### Te Reo Maori

Over the past few years we have filled our kete with waiata (songs) and reo (language). When Whaea Kavahna was working with us she wrote a new peheha for our school. We include our pepeha in our morning hui (gathering) and it is expected that all of the children will be able to introduce themselves and their families in te reo Maori. The classes are going to up the ante so that the children can share this introduction without reading it. This is especially important when they stand in our school assemblies. We would really appreciate your help with this learning. If you find any of the pronunciation tricky, the class teachers can help with this.

Pronouncing place names correctly is also a school wide area to develop. We'll start with Manakau. I have found writing the words phonetically can help Ma like Ma, na like nah and kau like car oo.

### Nga kupu hou (new words)

**Pepeha** - is a way of introducing yourself in Māori. It tells people who you are by sharing your connections with the people and places that are important to you.
