From Deb's desk

Last week was busy! The team and I were part of many opportunities to work with teaching colleagues from around the Horowhenua.

<u>Teacher Only Day - Ngati</u> Raukawatanga

On our teacher only day the staff and I spent the day at Matau Marae, in between Levin and Foxton, hosted by Ngati Huia ki Pouroutāwhao. It was a great opportunity to spend time with our teaching colleagues from around the Horowhenua and to learn some of the korero (stories) about our region. Each year we are hosted by a different Hapū. Lockdowns and social distancing over the last few years had slowed this down, however we are back in full swing. So far we have visited Poutu Marae in Shannon, Kereru Marae, in Koputaroa and now Matau. As part of our learning we visit significant sites. The Poroutāwhao Flour Mill replica that once stood near the Waitarere Stream was very interesting, and the property of Heather Heron-Speirs to learn about the cultural and ecological significance of this area was new learning for many. A lot of the activities we were involved in linked to other curriculum areas and we are excited to bring many of these into our school setting.

Professional Development for our team

Over the school year there are many opportunities for our teaching team to continue to develop. Not only did we have a teacher only day, we also had representatives attend professional development in Maths Leadership - focused on the proposed changes to the Maths curriculum, and three of the team attended Writing Moderation. Writing moderation looks at the consistency of assessment in writing across several schools. It helps us to know our assessment is rigorous, and in line with the curriculum expectations. It's also quite fun.

GRIP Student Leadership Conference

This is the first time we have attended this particular conference, and I took a team of 9 students for this practical and interactive experience.

We explored concepts like;

How to be an 'others first' Leader.

The people a leader can impact the most.

Ideas that impact everybody.

How to get everybody on board with a new idea. Why we lead.

Nga kupu hou (new words)

Kaitiakitanga - Guardianship and Protection. It is a way of managing the environment, based on the Māori world view. A kaitiaki is a guardian. This can be a person or group that cares for an area such as a lake or forest. They are given that role by the local iwi.

E.g. Heather Heron-Spiers is a kaitiakitanga of the Ngāwakahiamoe (Native Bush Reserve)
