

News from the Board

Our school has been working with SchoolDocs to create a website for our policies and procedures. We are excited to announce that the site is now live and available to our school community.

The school works on a subscription basis with SchoolDocs to maintain, update, and review our policies. SchoolDocs provides us with a comprehensive core set of policies, which have been well researched and align with the National Education and Learning Priorities. The policies and procedures are tailored to our school, and the school supplies specific information such as our charter, and procedures for behaviour management, reporting to parents, etc.

SchoolDocs updates, modifies, or creates policies in response to changes in legislation or Ministry guidelines, significant events, reviews/requests from schools, and regular reviewing from the SchoolDocs team. Our school board has the opportunity to view changes/additions and comment on them before they are implemented. We will advise you when policies are up for review and how you can take part in the review. We invite you to visit the site at https://manakau.schooldocs.co.nz (note that there's no "www."). Education Review Office (ERO) - Last week we began our 3 year review process with the ERO team. Maddy, our evaluation partner, spent a day with us. The Education Review Office | Te Tari Arotake Mātauranga (ERO) is the New Zealand government's external evaluation agency. They evaluate and report on the education and care of learners in schools. The 3 year review is a new way of working with schools, and Maddy spent quite a bit of time (this round) checking our policies and governance procedures. We will share updates from her as they come to hand.
