2023 End of Year Reporting

This year we have trialled a new process for reporting to parents. We are working to give whanau real time reporting with examples of students learning in reading, writing and maths.

In term 2 and 4 teachers have shared 'learning posts' utilising the SeeSaw App. On each post there is a description of the learning goal and where the child aligns with the NZ Curriculum expectations. In Term 2, we sought feedback from parents to check understanding. After discussing the feedback, we have added an additional post for Term 4. This post will have a general comment on your child's learning using the NZ Curriculum's Key Competencies as a reference.

About the key competencies

Key competencies are the capabilities people have and need to develop, to live and learn today and in the future.


The New Zealand Curriculum identifies five key competencies:

- Thinking
- Relating to others
- Using language, symbols, and texts
- Managing self
- Participating and contributing


