## Principal's Message ~ From Deb's Desk

I remember when my son Nathan had his first soccer game at the age of 5. His father and I despaired as our boy sat in the middle of the field picking at the grass, or when he did run with the pack of other children, like bees around the honey pot, he seemed too timid to actually get near the ball. We had no idea that our son would grow up to be a very talented sportsman, playing in the top teams for hockey and cricket at his Secondary School, or that he would revel in the physical nature of his chosen sports. Since leaving school, Nathan has continued to have a sporting focus, playing for community soccer and hockey teams.

To me, being a part of a primary school sports team is a vital part of our childhood. Often in these teams children are working with people from different schools, or people they haven't worked with before. Parents volunteer to coach or manage these teams. Sometimes they have lots of experience in these roles, and sometimes it's because they don't want their child to miss an opportunity, or they've drawn the short straw. Whatever the reason, it is a commitment that is at times under valued. As we start our Winter Sports season, please remember to be supportive of your child and their team. Positive comments from the side line are always appreciated, and so is an understanding that we all develop skills and talents at different rates. The following is an excerpt from a Sport NZ paper on the Sport in Schools;

"The sporting needs of children change as they develop not only physically but also emotionally, socially and cognitively. While the majority of children pass through the same developmental phases, each child develops at their own pace. Chronological age is a poor indicator of development and progress, especially in sport. There is no magic age at which a child is ready to play organised sport. Evidence suggests that success in sport does not depend on how early a child gets involved in sport, but is associated with a child participating when they are optimally ready to participate."

"I'm learning a new sport this year...hockey. I play golf too. I've got a few sports I could play when I'm older" - Ned Playing sport keeps me fit, it feels good when we win!" - Paisley "Kids enjoy the social side of it, the camaraderie you get in sport...and they develop longlasting friendships" – Soccer Coach

## **NEWS FROM THE BOARD – May 2018**

I hope the new term has started well for everyone.

Last Tuesday we held our first Board meeting for the term. It was good to hear of the continuing success of our students and the learning plans designed for our children this term. It was with a great deal of pride that we were told of our Schools' contribution to the Manakau community ANZAC ceremony. Our children's art work filled the community hall and our students remembered our fallen with pride, respect and a real sense of occasion. I would like to thank Pauline Masters for acknowledging the School's participation both through the Board and on a wider level through our local newspaper.

With the beginning of the new term it is timely just to say a big thank you to a group of people who have gone above and beyond in supporting our School community. While the Board will be contacting these people with an individual expression of thanks I would like to acknowledge Carl Gibson, Dwayne Fox, Carrie & Marty Yaxley and Dale & Doug Logan for the work they have done and support they have given our school community.

A recent audit of our school finances by the Crown concluded that our finances were being very well managed. Checks and balances had been set up to account for spending and regular detailed reports were made to the Board for review. Special acknowledgement was made both to Deb and Annette for their management and reporting of finances. I would also like to thank Paul White who oversees the finance portfolio for the Board for his work in managing this portfolio.

As a Board we set policies and procedures under a government framework called National Administration Guidelines. These guidelines allow Boards to set policy which follows legislative requirement but support the unique character of each school community. We review Policies on a 3-year cycle unless cause comes up to revisit or develop a new Policy, an example of this recently was a change to the Health and Safety laws which required us as a Board to adapt our current Policy. Last week we reviewed Policy on School Facilities and Grounds and Property Maintenance.

Under the School Facilities and Grounds Policy specific policy is set out that considers the Hiring of School Grounds and Buildings and Dogs on School grounds. We do have a school dog (Charlie) that the Board sees as contributing to the special character of the school but equally we also acknowledge that dogs can be foreign and scary to some children. As such the Policy was reviewed and procedures added that prescribe how children will be educated on safety around dogs. This will also cover the access management that children will have to Charlie during school and break times. I would encourage you to read all our Policies as they come out for community consultation and please do contact Deb at the first instance, or myself, with any queries or concerns. Any query or concern is welcome and will be handled with the greatest of sensitivity and respect.

The planning is now underway for our fantastic Manakau School Fair. This Fair not only raises much needed finances for the school but also serves to both build community collaboration, resolve and purpose, and market the school. With the greatest of respect and acknowledgment of the busy lives we all lead, if you can contribute through helping as part of the Organising Committee, please do see Deb.

Finally, I would like to profile our wonderful Board secretary, Annette Lucinsky. While Annette is not an elected Board member she is integral in the smooth running of the Board. Annette is responsible for the accurate recording of all Board matters and documentation. Away from the Board Annette is the face of Manakau School as the school's office administrator.
