Principal's Message ~ From Deb's Desk

Our school wide focus on 'community' has been driven by our Manakau Curriculum, developed in consultation with our students and parents and extended whanau in 2016. It is an exciting time to be in education. We acknowledge that it's not enough for children to just keep learning more information, they need to know how to use the information and work with others.

Children need to learn how to learn, how to think for themselves, think alongside others, and be motivated to keep on learning throughout their lives - so that they can do well in their world.

Key competencies help your child learn these things. They are included in the New Zealand Curriculum and are woven into all the teaching that goes on at school.

The key competencies are:

- thinking
- using language, symbols, and texts
- managing self
- relating to others
- participating and contributing

They are not just for school, but for life. Once you know about them, you will be able to see that your child uses these key competencies in many different situations - at home, at sport, at church, at cultural occasions, and eventually at work.

We have many families for whom Participating and Contributing is a strong focus, whether it is taking a lead in a club or church, planning a fund raising event, or just expecting that all family members will contribute to the tasks, that need to be completed, to keep the household running smoothly. It is a life long competency that ensures we are active members of our communities.

As we head into our long weekend I ask that you reflect on how your children participate and contribute to the running of your family. Do they make their beds, clean up the kitchen, feed the animals, do you sit and read to each other, help with the meal prep, talk about what's happening in their school space. In a time where children have so much they can receive (or want), take some time to show them what they can give back and how good it feels when they do so.
