You can call us on 105 for all non emergencies, or you can go online at 105.police.govt.nz to report things like: lost property, theft from a public place or car, intentional property damage, ore to ge an update or add info to a previous report.

In the event of an emergency, always call 111 for Things that are Happening Now.

Manakau Community Plan:

Our neighbourhoods and communities are what make the Horowhenua special. To better understand our local communities Council will be working with each of them to develop a Community Plan. The Manakau Community Plan is one of the first plans that Council would like to develop.

Council recognises that every community is different; each has its own unique identity and special characteristics. A Community Plan is effectively the voice of a community - it highlights common aspirations and goals and identifies how these can be achieved overtime.

Council would like to encourage as many people as possible, who live in or have a connection with Manakau, to get involved in the development of the Manakau Community Plan. Council will be engaging with the students over the next few weeks to get their ideas about what makes Manakau a great place as well as what can be done to enhance this place.
