#### School Donations for 2024

Over the past few years the Board have opted into the Government's School Donation Scheme, this will continue in 2024. The donations scheme is designed to ease pressure and expectations on families to pay donations even though they are voluntary.

#### Mathletics and Lexia Literacy Programme

This term students in Years 3-8 trialled a literacy programme called 'Lexia'. We have seen some excellent results for our learners in the areas of grammar, spelling and comprehension. Mathletics has been used in our school for many years to compliment specific teaching.

Both of these programmes are able to be accessed from home. They provide a link to the classroom learning and you can see first-hand what your child is working on.
